



LISTS OF ACCEPTABLE DOCUMENTS FOR DRIVER AUTHORIZATION CARD (DAC) ISSUANCE

All documents must be unexpired and valid

Effective November 14, 2016: Revised rule 18.19.5.12 NMAC provides that the documents listed below are acceptable as proof of identification number, lawful identity and residency for non-commercial driver's licenses and identification cards. Please see MVD Drivers Manual for more detail.

<i>Applicant may use one (1) item from LIST B in place of one of the required documents from LIST A, if the customer has a Social Security Number:</i>	<i>In conjunction with LIST A and LIST B, the application must also provide two (2) of the following documents to establish proof of New Mexico Residency:</i>
1. Social Security Number card	1. Current real property rental or purchase agreement
2. W-2 Form	2. Current local property tax statement or mortgage documents
3. SSA-1099 Form	3. Insurance bill, card, or binder, dated within 6 months
4. Non-SSA-1099 Form	4. A New Mexico medical or public assistance card with address, letter from issuing agency that came with card or profile printout from issuing agency
5. Pay stub that displays applicant's name and Social Security Number	5. Original documents from city, county, state, tribal, or federal government organization or community organization (dated within 60 days) attesting to the fact that the applicant is a New Mexico resident
	<i>The following documents must be dated within 60 days:</i>
	6. Utility bill, except cell phone bills
	7. Bank or credit card statement
	8. Employment pay stub containing applicant name & address
	9. Documentation from an education institution
	<i>Applicants under 18 may also provide:</i>
	10. Documents indicating membership in a NM religious or sports organization
	11. Affidavit of NM Residency (Form MVD-10021)

Applicants for an **identification card** not acceptable for federal purposes who are homeless or in temporary lodging and unable to provide two of the documents identified in paragraph B of this subsection may provide a notarized letter from a representative of a New Mexico governmental entity, not-for-profit organization, assisted care facility/home, adult assisted living facility/home, homeless shelter, transitional service provider, or group/half way house certifying to the address where the applicant resides or receives services *in lieu* of the documents required.
