



Effective October 17, 2016: Revised rule 18.19.5.12 NMAC provides that the documents listed below are acceptable proof for non-commercial REAL ID driver's licenses and Identification Cards.

Marriage and Divorce – For an original or certified copy of a marriage license or divorce decree, contact the county clerk's office in the county where the marriage license or divorce decree was issued - cost will vary.
